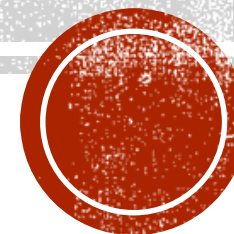

### Injured at Worlds, Neeraj will not defend CWG gold

**NEW DELHI:** Olympic gold medalist Neeraj Chopra's hopes of defending his javelin title at the Birmingham Commonwealth Games (CWG) were dashed on Tuesday due to a groin injury sustained during a historic silver medal at the World Athletics Championships in Eugene, Oregon on Saturday night.

India's sure-fire medal hope at the CWG had spoken of discomfort on Sunday, and the problem turned out to be serious enough for Chopra to pull out of the Birmingham Games.

"Neeraj Chopra had called me earlier today from the US to convey his inability to take part in the Birmingham 2022 Commonwealth Games owing to fitness concerns. Following his participation in the 2022 World Athletics Championships in Eugene, Chopra had an MRI scan done on Monday and, based on it, he has been advised a month's rest by his medical team," Indian Olympic Association (IOA) secretary-general Rajeev Mehta said in a statement on Tuesday.

Chopra was to be India's flag bearer in the opening ceremony of the 2022 CWG. The India contingent officials were yet to finalise his replacement till late on Tuesday.

### Borghain's coach gets event accreditation after complaint

**NEW DELHI:** A day after boxer Lovlina Borgohain, a Tokyo Olympic bronze medalist, complained of "mental harassment" because officials didn't accept her request for issuing accreditation for her personal coach, the issue was sorted out. Sandhya Gursing, Borgohain's personal coach, received

her Commonwealth Games (CWG) accreditation on Tuesday that will allow her access into the athlete Village and competition venues.

Borghain had said the treatment of Gurung was affecting her preparation for the CWG. "I'm facing harassment. Every time my coaches who helped me to win an Olympic

medal are removed from my training and competition," Borgohain had said in a statement on social media on Monday.

"Sandhya was brought to the Village today and given accreditation. She is with the team now," news agency PTI quoted an unnamed Indian Olympic Association official as saying on Tuesday.

### CENSUS EXERCISE INDEFINITELY PUT OFF BECAUSE OF COVID: GOVT

**NEW DELHI:** India's already delayed 2021 decadal census has been postponed "until further orders" due to the Covid-19 pandemic, the Union ministry of home affairs informed Parliament on Tuesday. This is not the first time the government has delayed the census citing the pandemic's constraints even though almost all pandemic related restrictions on mobility have been removed and many government surveys and contact intensive exercises such as elections are being conducted. While the government tried to underplay the gravity of the delayed census, independent experts have expressed grave concerns.

### God save EC if it can't stop poll freebies: SC

**NEW DELHI:** May God save the Election Commission of India (ECI) if it can only wring its hands when electorates are sought to be bribed through freebies, the Supreme Court observed on Tuesday, as it sought to know from the Finance Commission if revenue allocation to states can take into account unnecessary expenditures on hand out.

The top court found itself constrained to seek the help of the Finance Commission after ECI said that it cannot regulate promises of freebies even as the Union government assigned the responsibility to ECI for taking all possible steps under the existing legal regime.

Termining unrealistic poll promises and freebies a "serious" problem, a bench headed



by Chief Justice of India NV Ramana, said that the contentious practice has to be controlled and that the court will, therefore, seek the views of the Finance Commission if something can be done in this regard.

"God save the Election Commission of India if it's saying that we can't do anything when the

electorates are sought to be bribed through freebies. We are suggesting that this (freebies) has to be controlled. How it is going to be done needs to be examined," said the bench, which also included justices Krishna Murari and Hima Kohli.

## DIGITAL TRANSFORMATION THROUGH 5G SERVICES

India must rollout 5G services as a priority in order to enable digital transformation in Governance, Ease of Living, and Ease of Doing Business. 5G, the newest generation of mobile communication technology, offers a diverse toolbox of features that can be used to solve business problems and social challenges in new ways, representing a new way of working and thinking.

Under a fully developed 5G ecosystem across the nation, it is estimated that around 30% of the end nodes will be user-mobiles, whereas the remaining 70% will be nomadic or static Internet of Things (IoT) devices. More importantly, this also means that the network requirements for these two categories are very different. Fortunately, 5G also includes a feature called "Network Slicing" that enables the



manage their systems and processes, as opposed to being used by consumers or user mobiles.

In particular, it is noteworthy that 5G's direct contribution to the Indian economy is estimated to be USD 450 billion over the next 15 years. 5G must be considered a

wireless networks as an operational technology in their respective systems to improve efficiency and resilience. The incorporation of 5G will trigger another transformative leap forward, through pervasive digitisation, to also bring greater flexibility, scalability, and responsiveness in such systems. The Industry 4.0 conceptualizes the rapid convergence of these technologies, industries, and societal patterns and processes in the 21st century due to increasing interconnectivity and smart automation. 5G will act as the gears of this system, enabling these technologies to operate with each other. A prime example is the manufacturing sector where every
